2011 Conference Offers Numerous Opportunities to Participate and Share

In continuing a strong tradition of focusing on the experience of the attendees, the upcoming WSKW conference offers numerous opportunities for members to share and participate. The following formats may be selected when preparing an abstract. The deadline to submit abstracts for the 2011 WSKW Conference is June 15th. Please visit www.wskw.org to submit abstracts online.

Round Table Discussion

A moderator briefly presents the issue and open discussion immediately follows. This is THE traditional format from which WSKW sessions were built.

Panel Discussion Session

A selection of panelists with expertise or insight on a topic. The session proceeds as follows: Topic - Concept - Positions - Discussion – Reflection.

Scientific Paper Presentation

Research papers, projects, or other scholarly activities may be presented as presentations, and subsequently submitted to the WSKW Review for publication the following year.

Open Discussion Session

The purpose of the open forum is to allow conferees to join a group of professionals to discuss pertinent topics.

Hot Topic Discussion Session

A hot topic in kinesiology or wellness can be presented in either a Round Table, Panel format or as a single presentation. Usually position papers are submitted for a hot topic to be published in the Western Society Review, and then defended during the hot topic presentation. This year's hot topic: "What is the purpose of today's kinesiology and wellness professional organizations (AAHPERD, WSKW, etc)?"

Dr. G. Arthur Broten "Young Scholars" Program

This program provides the opportunity for young professionals in physical education and related fields to present professional papers focusing specifically on issues that confront the profession. Candidates must be full-time faculty members in the field of physical education at a college or university.

12th Annual R. D. Peavy Student Papers

The Peavy Papers provide a forum for students to present refereed research at Western Society. Undergraduate students are encouraged to present a poster of either original works or reviews of another author's research.
