

"THE PEAVY PAPERS"

Named after Dr. Robert Peavy, retired faculty member at Washington State University, the "R.D. Peavy Student Symposium" is an annual event at the WSKW Conference. Introduced in 1999 by Dr. Larry Bruya, retired faculty member from Washington State University, the R.D. Peavy Papers session provides a forum for presentation and discussion of student professional work. Submissions can reflect any topic in health, fitness, sport, nutrition, or wellness. Collaborative work with faculty is encouraged. Undergraduate and graduate students are encouraged to submit their work in one of three categories:

- 1. **Research Critique:** Consists of a 1-page critique of a professional research article (intended for first year student authors).
- 2. **Literature Review:** Consists of a 1-page review of several research articles (intended for first or second year student authors).
- Original Research or Project: Consists of a 2-page report detailing a student-coordinated research study or creative project (intended for second or third year student authors).

All papers undergo a formal peer review process by trained students and faculty. If the paper is accepted, the required presentation format is an academic poster. Please contact the coordinator of the Peavy Papers program Justin Ulbright, julbright@whitworth.edu, for more information.
